Rules and Regulations

EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT USEF RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH.

All questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the show management whose decision shall be final.

Every horse entered for competition will comply with the rules of the horse show management, but management will, in no case, be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold this horse show and the officials and employees of the show blameless for any loss or accident to his horse, employees, equipment, which may occur from sickness, fire or otherwise.

Every class offered herein which is covered by the Rules & Specifications of the current USEF Rule Book will be conducted and judged in accordance there within.

All horses competing must be properly identified and must have a Registration Number from USHJA.

Prize money will be deducted from the total entry fees, any prize money in excess of the total entries will be paid in the form of a check within 30 days of the close of competition.

The management reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries, disqualify any riders or exhibitors, prohibit entries and cancel award prizes without claims for damages; to cancel or combine unfilled classes, or to reschedule classes after due notice to exhibitors; to change rings or rotate judges.

Exhibitors are notified that any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the judges or officials, on the part of the owner, manager, rider, or groom shall disqualify the horse, and the owner shall forfeit his entry fee and other fees.

Show management reserves to itself the power to prohibit any person from attending or showing a horse in the ring and to remove any groom or horse from the show without being liable for compensation.

In accordance with the 1989 Federal Waste Tracking Act, which restricts the disposal of medical waste, bio-hazardous medical waste containers will be provided in the stable area. All exhibitors and their agents are responsible for the proper disposal of this waste.

No person will be allowed in the show ring during the time of judging except the exhibitor and those having official or requested duties to perform.

It is the tradition of the show that riders be correctly attired for the class in question, that attendants be neatly dressed and the horses properly presented. Management may in its discretion bar any person from entering the ring if not suitable presented to appear before an audience.

USEF Membership Statement

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Preliminary Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$30 Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes

FEDERATION ENTRY AGREEMENT By entering a Federation-licensed Competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaultor or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of The United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (the "Federation") and the local rules of Cornerstone Farm. I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and of the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered. I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the Competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cable - casts, broadcasts, internet, film, new media or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation. The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR908.4.

UNITED STATES EQUESTRIAN FEDERATION, INC. ENTRY AGREEMENT I have read the United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (the "Federation") Entry Agreement (GR906.4) as printed in the Prize List for this Competition and agree to all of its provisions. I understand and agree that by entering this Competition, I am subject to Federation Rules, the Prize List, and local rules of the competition. I agree to waive the right to the use of my photos at the competition, and agree that any actions against the Federation must be brought in New York State. Release, Assumption of Risk, Waiver and Indemnification This document waives important legal rights. Read it carefully before signing.

I AGREE in consideration for my participation in this Competition to the following: I AGREE that the "Federation" and "Competition" as used above includes all of their officials, officers, directors, employees, agents, personnel, volunteers and affiliated organizations.

I AGREE that I choose to participate voluntarily in the Competition with my horse, as a rider, driver, handler, vaultor, longeur, lessee, owner, agent, coach, trainer, or as parent or guardian of a junior exhibitor. I am fully aware and acknowledge that horse sports and the Competition involve inherent dangerous risks of accident, loss, and serious bodily injury including broken bones, head injuries, trauma, pain, suffering, or death ("Harm").

I AGREE to hold harmless and release the Federation and the Competition from all claims for money damages or otherwise for any Harm to me or my horse and for any Harm of any nature caused by me or my horse to others, even if the Harm arises or results, directly or indirectly, from the negligence of the Federation or the Competition.

I AGREE to expressly assume all risks of Harm to me or my horse, including Harm resulting from the negligence of the Federation or the Competition.

I AGREE to indemnify (that is, to pay any losses, damages, or costs incurred by) the Federation and the Competition and to hold them harmless with respect to claims for Harm to me or my horse, and for claims made by others for any Harm caused by me or my horse while at the Competition. I have read the Federation Rules about protective equipment, including GR801 and, if applicable, EV114 and I understand that I am entitled to wear protective equipment without penalty, and I acknowledge that the Federation strongly encourages me to do so while WARNING that no protective equipment can guard against all injuries. If I am a parent or guardian of a junior exhibitor, I consent to the child's participation and AGREE to all of the above provisions and AGREE to assume all of the obligations of this Release on the child's behalf. I represent that I have the requisite training, coaching and abilities to safely compete in this competition.

I AGREE that if I am injured at this competition, the medical personnel treating my injuries may provide information on my injury and treatment to the Federation on the official USEF accident/injury report form. BY SIGNING an entry blank,

I AGREE to be bound by all applicable Federation Rules and all terms and provisions

Motorized Vehicle Statement –

In accordance with GR901.29

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. **The parent(s), legal guardian(s), or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation.** Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Chapter 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

Please note that not all classes/divisions may be offered at every show

LEADLINE SUITABILITY & EQUITATION

Open to riders who have not reached their 7th birthday and have not competed in any other classes in a USEF recognized show other than leadline. Entries may be asked to trot. Riders to be judged on elementary fundamentals of horsemanship. An adult is required to lead each entry.

WALK TROT

Open to riders 10 years and under who have not competed in any class requiring them to canter or jump at any recognized show. Riders showing in this division may not compete in any short stirrup classes. Riders will be asked to walk and trot in both directions of the ring. They will be judged on position and ability to control their mount. Diagonals will be considered.

SHORT STIRRUP

Open to riders 12 years of age and under who have never competed over fences exceeding 18" in a recognized show. Riders showing in this division may not compete in any other recognized division or class in a show with fences exceeding 18" with the exception of pleasure and Pet Type Pony classes. Course no to exceed eight fences, fences not to exceed 18".

MODIFIED ADULT EQUITATION

Open to adult amateur riders who, as of Dec. 1 of the current show year, have not won six blue ribbons at any recognized shows in Adult Equitation Classes.

HUNTER DIVISIONS

Championship and Reserve shall be awarded to two of the top four horses that have acquired the most points performing over fences. In addition to these points, only these horses shall receive points for ribbons won in under saddle class. All over fences classes to be judged on performance and soundness. Jogging for soundness at judge's discretion.

AMATEUR ADULT HUNTER (18-35Years) (Over 35 years)

To be ridden by Amateurs who are no longer eligible to compete as Junior Exhibitors. Horse/Rider combination is not eligible for any other MHC, NEHC, or USEF rated classes. Horse may be shown by a different rider in any other division or class at the same competition. To be judged on performance, soundness, manners, way of going, size of rider to mount, and suitability as an Adult Amateur Hunter. Height of fences 3' spread not to exceed height of fence. Ponies may be ridden by Adults, suitability to count. Exception: Equitation and Pleasure classes.

MODIFIED ADULT HUNTER

Open to horse and ponies ridden by Amateur Adults. Fences 2'6". Rider may not cross enter into Amateur Adult Hunter Division.

CHILDREN'S/ADULT SPECIAL HUNTER

Open to amateur adult and junior riders. No professionals. Open to horse and ponies that have not jumped 3" or over in the previous year, OR riders that have not shown at 3' or over in the previous year. Fences not to exceed 2'6". No in and outs.

CHILDRENS HUNTER

To be shown by Junior Exhibitors. Exhibitors 15-17 years of age must be eligible for intermediate equitation over fences as of December 1 of the current show year. HORSE- fences 3'
PONIES- fences 2' for small and medium ponies, 2'6" for large ponies.

PONY HUNTER

To be run in accordance with USEF rules.

JUNIOR HUNTER

To be run in accordance with USEF rules.

HUNTER PLEASURE

Open to all horse of hunter type ordinarily used for pleasure purposes with no limitations as to status of rider. Shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Light contact with the horse's mouth is required.

LOW HUNTER

Open to all horse and ponies.

MEDALS

9. DOWNEAST MODIFIED AM/AD MEDAL Open to riders 18 years of age or older, competing on horses or ponies. Riders shall be required to perform over a minimum of six fences with at least change of direction. Fence heights shall be 2'3". 25% of contestants, at least 2 riders, shall be called back for individual testing. Testing optional. (USEF Tests 1-8)

19. DOWNEAST AMATEUR ADULT MEDAL Open to amateur riders 18 years of age or older, competing on horses or ponies. Contestants shall be required to perform over a minimum of six fences with at least one change of direction. Fence heights shall be 2'6"-2'9". 25% of contestants, at least 2 riders, shall be called back for individual testing. Testing optional. (USEF Tests 1-19).

20. MHC AMATEUR ADULT HUNT SEAT MEDAL* Open to adult members of MHC. All contestants are required to perform over at least 8 fences 2'6" to 2'9", with at least one change of direction. One or more individual tests of the top four contestants may be requested at the judge's discretion. (USEF Tests 1— 17). To fill a class at least four competitors must complete the course.

21. NEHC AMATEUR ADULT HUNT SEAT MEDAL All contestants are required to perform over at least 8 fences not to exceed 3'0" with a combination and two changes of direction after the first obstacle. One or more individual tests (USEF Tests 1-19) of the top four competitors may be requested at the judge's discretion. To fill a class at least four competitors must complete the course.

22. ARIAT NATIONAL ADULT MEDAL To be shown over a minimum of eight fences 2'9" to 3' in height, spread not to exceed fence height. The course may be either a Jumper or Hunter type course and must include at least two changes of direction and a combination. Water obstacles (i.e.; water jump, liverpool) are not permitted. The top four riders are required to perform at least two individual tests from USEF Tests 1-19. An Open Numerical Scoring System must be used in the first round, with each rider's score announced at the completion of their round. There is no minimum requirement to complete the class.

23. MARSHALL & STERLING ADULT MEDAL Open to all members of the USEF or CEF who are eligible to compete in the Amateur Adult Hunter section at this show. All competitors are required to perform over at least 8 fences 2'9" to 3'0", spreads not to exceed fence height. The course may be either a jumper or hunter type course and must include at least two changes of direction and a combination. Water obstacles not permitted. The top 4 riders are required to perform at least two individual tests from USEF Tests 1—19. An open numerical scoring system will be used for the first round and scores announced at the completion of their round.

69. DOWNEAST SHORT STIRRUP EQUITATION MEDAL Open to riders 12 years of age and under, competing on horses or ponies. All ages (Short and Long Stirrup) compete together at the qualifying shows, but age groups will be divided at the finals. Riders must not have shown over fences that exceed 18". Riders shall be required to perform a minimum of six fences with at least one change of direction. Fence height will be 18". 25% of contestants, at least 2, may be called back for individual testing. Testing optional, verbal recommended. USEF tests 1-8.

32. MHC HUNT SEAT MINI-MEDAL* Entry Fee: \$40.00 Open to junior members of the MHC who have not reached their 15th birthday and have not competed in classes in which entry is required to jump higher than 3'0". All competitors are to compete over a course not exceeding 8 fences and not less than 6, excluding combinations, at a height not to exceed 2'6". One or more individual tests may be requested at the judge's discretion (USEF Tests 1-8). To fill a class at least four competitors must complete the course.

33. DOWNEAST MODIFIED JUNIOR MEDAL Open to riders 17 years of age and under, competing on horses or ponies. Contestants shall be required to perform over a minimum of six fences with at least one change of direction. Fence heights will be 2'3". 25% of the contestants, a minimum of 2 riders, may be called back for individual testing. Testing optional.

34. USEF PONY MEDAL Complete class specs may be found at USEF.org. Fences 2'3", 2'6", 3"

44 DOWNEAST JUNIOR MEDAL Open to riders 17 years of age and under, competing on horses or ponies. Riders shall be required to perform over a minimum of six fences with at least one change of direction. Fence heights shall be 2'9". 25% of the contestants, a minimum of 2 riders, may be called back for individual testing. Testing optional. USEF tests 1-19

45 MHC JUNIOR HUNT SEAT MEDAL CLASS Open to all members of MHC who have not reached their 18th birthday. All contestants are required to perform over at least eight fences not exceeded 3'0". One or more individual tests of the top four contestants may be required at the judge's discretion (USEF Tests 1-19). To fill a class, at least four competitors must complete the course.

46. T.H.I.S. NATIONAL CHILDRENS MEDAL Open to Junior members of the USEF or CEF who have never competed in a National Equitation Finals with fences at 3'6". All contestants are required to perform over at least 8 fences 2'9" to 3'0", spreads not to exceed fence height, with at least two changes of direction and a combination. The top four riders, or 20% of the first round competitors, whichever is greater, are required to perform at least two individual tests from USEF Tests 1- 19. An open numerical scoring system will be used in the first round with scores announced at the completion of the round.

47. MARSHALL & STERLING CHILDRENS MEDAL Open to Junior members of the USEF or CEF who have never competed in a National Equitation Finals with fences at 3'6". All contestants are required to perform over at least 8 fences 2'9" to 3'0", spreads not to exceed fence height, with at least two changes of direction and a combination. The top four riders, or 20% of the first round competitors, whichever is greater, are required to perform at least two individual tests from USEF Tests 1- 19. An open numerical scoring system will be used in the first round with scores announced at the completion of the round

48. NEHC JUNIOR HUNT SEAT MEDAL CLASS Open to Junior members of the NEHC who have not reached their 18th birthday. All contestants are required to perform over at least eight fences not to exceed 3'3" with at least change of direction. One or more individual tests of the top four contestants may be requested at the judge's discretion. (USEF Tests 1-19). To fill a class, at least four competitors must complete the course. One win required for the finals.

Two or more tests of the top four competitors are required. The same horse must be used in all phases. Only one rider per horse. Three riders must complete the course in order for points to count. The rider must be a member in order for points to count toward qualifying for the Finals. May not be combined with any other M&S Medal
